

"Save Regina" Update, May 15, 2005

Good news – Regina has not yet been deported. Scary news – the threat looms greater every day and this work week (May 16-20) is crucial. Great news – you can definitely help!

Thanks to the excellent work of Attorney Mary L. Sfasciotti (fish-ODD-y) of Chicago, who just filed three major motions, we now ask you to join our massive lobbying effort. It's time to let major decision-makers, especially the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA) know that there are a whole lot of us from all over the country monitoring their response!

Sfasciotti has filed Motions with the following offices on Regina's behalf:

- Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA) -- Motion to Reopen Application for Asylum Based on Changed Country Conditions and Because of Ineffective Assistance of Counsel
- U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) -- Motion for a Stay of Deportation
- U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Chicago -- Writ of Habeas Corpus claiming that Regina is wrongfully incarcerated and should be released immediately and that a restraining order be issued to prevent officials from re-detaining Regina.

Letters supporting these motions are now being written by Wisconsin legislators, Senator Russ Feingold, Senator Herb Kohl and Representative Gwen Moore. The Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors will also send letters by express mail on Monday. Archbishop Timothy Dolan is writing again, and St. Mary Parish leaders will send their letters express on Monday. (See letter at www.SaveRegina.org) .
